School-Based Social Work Practice Certificate

The School of Social Work offers MSSW students the opportunity to graduate with a certificate in School-Based Social Work Practice. This certificate program prepares both Clinical and APP students to be school-based social work practitioners. School-based social workers are an integral link between school, home, and community in helping students achieve academic success. They work directly with school administrations as well as with students and families, providing leadership in forming school discipline policies, mental health interventions, crisis management, and support services. As part of an interdisciplinary team to help students succeed, social workers also facilitate community involvement in the schools while advocating for student success.

Certificate Requirements

The School-Based Social Work Practice certificate program is composed of one anchor course, Social Work Practice in Schools, elective and selective coursework, 20 hours of professional development and an approved practicum placement. All coursework counted toward earning a certificate must be taken at the graduate level at the School of Social Work or through approved out-of-department classes. The student is responsible for documenting that all requirements for the certificate have been successfully completed. Throughout enrollment in the certificate program, the program coordinator will provide ongoing support, including guidance on course selection, practicum alignment, and progress tracking to ensure students stay on track toward completion.

Approved Practicum Placement

Certificate students may complete their practicum in settings that serve or engage with their population of interest, including specialized agencies, schools, or broader organizations offering relevant services. School-Based Social Work Practice certificate students will complete one official practicum focused on school-based social work practice. Students will interact with school administrators, students, and families to varying degrees, depending on the site. The placement is a key educational component, providing students with hands-on learning and an opportunity to apply and integrate classroom-based knowledge. This placement may occur in the student's first or final practicum experience. Securing a final practicum placement is a competitive process. Students must confirm with the certificate coordinator that their placement meets the requirements of the certificate program. Because of external factors, such as funding, placement is competitive and not guaranteed at any specific agency. Regardless of placement, all students gain valuable experience through specialized coursework, practicum opportunities, and faculty mentorship, preparing them for effective practice across various social work environments.

Additional Proposed Coursework

All students in the School Social Work Certificate program must take the Anchor Course: Social Work Practice in Schools, as well as three additional course options listed on page two. Other courses may be approved through consultation with the certificate coordinator.

Professional Development

Certificate students are required to engage in a minimum of 20 hours of professional development during the course of their graduate program, either through conference attendance, training participation and/or research project participation that relates to School-Based Social Work

Practice. Professional development hours must be approved by the certificate coordinator prior to the certificate being awarded and may not count toward the fulfillment of requirements of another course or program at the School.
